Since 1997, New Creations Housing Program has been the only transitional housing program to provide services to all populations: single men, single women, and families. Although New Creations, Inc. is a housing program, it continues to support its mission to improve the quality and safety of life for the poor and economically disadvantaged; this includes healthy environments. As the Founder/Executive Director, Pastor Jeremiah McGhee makes it a point to open doors that were once impassable by providing resources and supportive

services to those that want to secure permanent housing and live a healthy lifestyle. Recognized by the Metro Omaha Tobacco Action Coalition-MOTAC, NCI increased the number of families protected from the dangers of tobacco and secondhand smoke exposure by implementing smoke-free policies for its properties. Since 1988, N.E.T.W.O.R.K. has been dedicated to providing academic enrichment, prevention education, career and social skills development, and cultural awareness for youth ages 6 – 18. N.E.T.W.O.R.K. Inc. is a culturally diverse leadership and family services program that

offers resources on HIV, alcohol, tobacco, and other drugs. Two years ago, Dwight Tillman was hired as the outreach specialist for N.E.T.W.O.R.K. to raise awareness of tobacco use and target marketing in the African American community.

Mr. Tillman made it a point to educate anyone, young or old, about the dangers of tobacco and secondhand smoke. He particularly took interest in the fight against tobacco because of his asthma condition. Earlier this year, Mr. Tillman passed away from a severe asthma attack. He will be greatly missed!

Not In Mama's Kitchen!

Not In Mama's Kitchen (NIMK) is a smoke-free homes initiative. Its goal is to educate and empower women, especially mothers, to protect their families from the dangers of tobacco use and exposure to secondhand smoke. Exposure to secondhand smoke is the third leading cause of preventable death

in the United States. We can do something about that!

Since NIMK's inception, over 350 women have taken the smoke-free home pledge; that amounting to 1,200 children protected from the ill effects of secondhand smoke.

From generation to generation, whether you are in your kitchen or another part of your home, we know that whatever Mama says goes.

Did You Know?

On June 22, 2009, President Barack Obama signed into law the Family Smoking Prevention and Tobacco Control Act, giving the U.S. Food and Drug Administration (FDA) comprehensive authority to regulate the manufacturing, marketing, and sale of tobacco products. The new law represents the most sweeping action taken to date to reduce what remains the leading preventable cause of death in the United States. *The Tobacco Control Legal Consortium*

New Creations TATU presented at the 2009 YEOH-“Youth Expression Of Health” summit at North High School. Presenters, Victoria Young & Nathaniel Young did a great job. Approximately 82 youth between the ages of 12-18 attended the peer-to-peer presentation, “Youth Advocacy-Do You Have The Power?”.

To date, over 400 youth have participated in the three-day educational event on health.

New Creations TATU hosted the Back To School Picnic at Fontanelle Park. Grilled hot dogs and a hilarious game of kick-ball “Boys vs. Girls” were a couple of highlights of the afternoon. More than 75 family and friends joined the fun.

In recognition of commitment and support, TATU staff, youth, and volunteers were given “It Starts With You!” certificates for another successful year in tobacco prevention and awareness.

New Creations TATU won FIRST PLACE for the Community Spirit Award at the 2009 Red Ribbon walk/rally! TATU youth wore t-shirts “I’m Not A Jerk, I Am Tobacco Free!” and danced to the song “You’re A Jerk” with Ciggy-a fictional cigarette character. TATU youth started the “Each One Bring One” challenge, bringing someone new to the event and four (4) participants won prizes from the drawing!

The Nebraska Tobacco Quitline is available to all Nebraskans who want to quit smoking.

The toll free Quitline gives you 24/7 access to tobacco cessation counseling and support services.

Nebraska Medicaid now covers counseling and certain drugs specifically used to help clients quit using tobacco.

Medicaid clients must be at least 18 years of age, registered and actively participating in the Quitline program.

Both English and Spanish speaking counselors are available.

Do it for yourself and the loved ones in your life.

Did you know that:

20 minutes after quitting

- Your blood pressure drops back to normal and the temperature of your hands and feet increase, returning to normal.

8 hours after quitting

- Carbon monoxide level in your blood drops to normal.

24 hours after quitting

- Your chances for having a heart attack decrease.

2 days after quitting

- Your taste and smell improves.

1 year after quitting

- Your risk for heart disease is reduced by 50%.
