

How to make your campus tobacco-free



- 1. Decide why you want to be tobacco-free or smoke-free
- 2. Determine date policy goes into effect (1 year minimum)
- 3. Decide on exceptions (residence halls, cars, etc)
- 4. Meet with employees to discuss why the policy is being adopted
- 5. Meet with students to discuss why the policy is being adopted
- 6. Develop messaging campaign including signage, web page, etc.
- 7. Determine length of time to seek compliance with no enforcement
- 8. Teach the importance of compliance with policy
- 9. Inform prospective students, parents, visitors, vendors, RFP's, etc.
- 10. Continue communication via small groups (supervisors, focus groups, etc.)
- 11. Train employees (possibly students) to engage those violating the policy
- 12. Print cards for passive communication with those violating policy
- 13. Decide when hard enforcement with repeat offenders will begin
- 14. Decide on enforcement methodology (warning, citation, citation plus visit)
- 15. Communicate enforcement process
- 16. Manage expectations No policy achieves 100% compliance
- 17. Always treat people with respect, do not demonize tobacco users
- 18. Communicate at orientation, through HR, announcements, etc.
- 19. Thank people for cooperating with the tobacco-free campus policy
- 20. Seek compliance with first time violators, penalize those who repeat
