Prevent

Public Health is the prevention of disease in our community.

Kick Butts Contest. Students were invited to participate in a radio commercial contest. 2,004 students submitted a total of 69 commercials. Four commercials were produced by the students were and aired during the week of Kick Butts Day. The response in the community was positive, as they heard the voices of their own children address this public health issue on radio.

Promote

Public Health is the promotion of good health in our community. The WIC program promotes good health through healthy supplemental foods, health care referrals and nutrition education for low income mothers and children up to age 5.

The Women, Infant and Children (WIC) Program saw tremendous growth during 2009. WIC served 2,915 clients and had a total of 21,256 contacts with these clients. A 9% increase from last year. Also in 2009, in coordination with the city of Schuyler and Alegent Hospital, WIC opened a permanent location in Colfax County.

Protect

Public Health is protecting our community. During the first pandemic of our century, H1N1, our staff and volunteers protected our families by immunizing our community.

Il schools within the ECDHD service area report student absences. Many absences reported in fall 2009 were related to influenza like illness (ILI). In early October, ECDHD staff and volunteers took H1N1 vaccine on the road to every school in the four County service area, immunizing 7,000 children in 38 schools. As a result, by December, the incidence of ILI decreased sharply.

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

This is Public Health...

Maternal Child Health provides immunization administration through the Vaccines for Children Program, paternity testing, and school health screens at rural and private schools in the four-county area. During 2009, 2.174 children received 6,000 vaccines. Children were screened at area schools, and 105 paternity tests were done. The State of Nebraska Immunization Program reports that ECDHD has the most thorough records in the State. During a recent program assessment, 100% of children who receive services with the ECDHD MCH program were up to date with their immunizations by age 2.
